CALL: WINTER SCHOOL 'CAUSAL MEDIATION ANALYSIS AND MACHINE LEARNING'

3-4 February 2020, Esch-sur-Alzette, Luxembourg

This winter school aims at advancing the knowledge and expertise of PhD students as well as junior researchers in the field of causal inference and programme evaluation. The first part of the two-day training session will focus on mediation analysis, which aims at disentangling a causal effect (e.g. the health effect of education) into different causal mechanisms (e.g. the health effect of education working through increased income). The second part will consider machine learning techniques aiming at leveraging big data with a large number of (control) variables for optimising outcome prediction and causal inference.

The workshop will be provided at LISER by Martin Huber, Professor and Chair of Applied Econometrics/Evaluation of Public Policies at the 'Department of Economics' of the University of Fribourg. The format of the training will comprise both lectures on various methods of causal mediation analysis and machine learning as well as empirical examples using the statistical software R.

(United Kingdom), CEET-CNAM (France), CMIST-UNIMAN (United Kingdom), WageIndicator-CELSI (Slovakia). These free-of-charge visits can contain between 5 and 15 working days and visitors receive a partial reimbursement of travel costs and a subsistence allowance.

Each of the host institutes has expertise in and access to leading European (comparative) datasets or expertise in working with specialized statistical techniques for social sciences research. During a visit users get the opportunity to work together with experts from the host institution on their own project, receive access to, and support and guidance in the use of the data, advice on methodological questions and on the progress of their project. Candidates can apply for a visiting grant through the online application form.
